



Staff enacted the story of 'Goldilocks and the three Bears'.....




...and parents were invited to come into the group to read to the children.

Pancake Day

Pancake Day, also known as Shrove Tuesday, is the last day before the Christian period called Lent and always falls 47 days before Easter Sunday. For some, lent is a time of abstinence, of giving things up. So Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that aren't allowed in Lent, and why we have pancakes.

To mark the day children decorated their own paper pancake with a choice of healthy toppings. Throughout the day we read Mr Wolf's Pancakes by Jan Fearnley and 'The Runaway Pancake' by Maira Mackinnon. Using a beanbag and a frying pan we encouraged children to try and 'flip' the 'pancake'.



PARKING
